Was transferred to Shoreham Camp about 6 months ago – consulted
Medical Officer 3rd Norfolk Regiment – M.O. diagnosed “bad heart” &
patient was sent to Eastborne (Summerdown Camp) – was there about 6
months & whilst there suffered from pain around the heart at times. At
Shoreham appeared before a Medical Board, November 1915 – patient
permanently unfit for war service.
