Samuel served as a Private with the 7th, 2nd, and 1st Norfolk Regiment between 1915 and 1917, and had two regimental numbers – 17219 and 17289.

He was wounded twice, developed enterec fever, then returned to serve in the 1st Norfolk Regiment but was injured again. On each occasion he was admitted to a different hospital – *see letters in main folder.* He then joined the 13th King's Liverpool Regiment, regimental number 95129.
