## Battalions of the New Armies 7th (Service) Battalion

Formed at Norwich in August 1914 as part of K1 and came under orders of 35th Brigade in 12th (Eastern) Division. 31 May 1915 : landed at Boulogne.

## 8th (Service) Battalion

Formed at Norwich in September 1914 as part of K2 and came under orders of 53rd Brigade in 18th (Eastern) Division. 25 July 1915 : landed at Boulogne. 12 February 1918 : disbanded in France, officers and men going to 7th and 9th Battalions.

## 9th (Service) Battalion

Formed at Norwich in September 1914 as part of K3 and came under orders of 71st Brigade in 24th Division.

30 August 1915 : landed at Boulogne.

15 October 1915 : transferred with Brigade to 6th Division.

## 10th (Reserve) Battalion

Formed in Walton on the Naze in October 1914 as Service battalion, part of K4.

November 1914 : came under orders of 94th Brigade, original 31st Division.

10 April 1915 : became a Reserve battalion.

1 September 1916 : converted into 25th Training Reserve Battalion in<br/>6th Reserve Brigade.(Source: Wikipedia)
