SOLDIERS WELCOME HOME. – Through the kindness of **Captain and Mrs. Neave** a large gathering of the parishioners assembled at Holy Grove on Wednesday, June 24th, to give a hearty welcome to our brave men who had returned home from the war. From funds collected, a substantial meal, consisting of roast and boiled beef and plum pudding, was provided, and each soldier was accompanied by his nearest relative or lady friend. Subsequently, Captain Neave proposed the health of the King, then that of the returned soldiers and absent friends, to which all most heartily responded, then followed a short address of welcome by the Vicar. Later on, the interest was further sustained by music and singing and a conjuring entertainment; and finally the proceedings closed with hearty vote of thanks to the committee and others who took part in making the reception so successful.
