



Military & War Service:

Inland Water Transport Corps, Royal Engineers (IWTCRE), Regimental No. 68152.

IWTCRE operated the French and Belgian canals and rivers of the area held by the British Forces. Only the waterways of Northern France were used but the value of their service became so apparent that it in the summer of 1915 was extended to the River Somme and in September 1916 to the Seine and eventually to a service between Dunkirk and Le Havre, and a cross channel service between Calais and Richborough.

The tonnage moved by IWT increased from just under 200,000 tons in 1915 to over 2,800,000 tons in 1918.
