Military and War Service:

Ambrose enlisted February 1917, aged 18yrs 5mths with Training Reserve Battalion. On enlistment his occupation is recorded as farm labourer.

A copy of his enlistment document is in “The Saul Family” display folder though is very faint.

Ambrose was sent to the BEF (British Expeditionary Force) on 30th October 1917 and later joined the 15th Battalion Sherwood Foresters (Notts and Derby Regiment).

Death: Sadly, just 5 months later, on 28th March 1918, Ambrose was reported missing, presumed killed. The War Diaries for the Sherwood Foresters is available online and indicate “many casualties” around this time.

Memorial: Remembered with honour at Pozieres Memorial, France which is 6km north east of the town of Albert, and also at Irstead Church.
